

The project should take about one week to complete and will be completed by Quality Fence.

















Defend Against Drafts:



Installing storm doors and windows can improve heating efficiency by up to 45%.

Plastic window insulation kits are easy solutions for drafty windows.





Create a draft snake by rolling up a towel and placing it along the bottom of a door

Walls, floors and attics need adequate insulation. To confirm how much you need, consult www.energy.gov.





Properly caulked doors and windowsills can decrease heating bills by up to 30%

Add foam insulation inserts into your wall outlets to eliminate this little known draft source.

Tame Your Temperature:



Setting ceiling fans to spin clockwise will increase air circulation and can impact heating costs by up to 10%.

Programmable thermostats can help regulate temperatures when you are not at home.



For every degree you can lower the temperature in your house you can lower your heating bill by 1-3%.

Lowering your hot water tank from 140 degrees to 120 degrees can reduce heating costs by 6-10%.





Invest in an energy monitor to manage the energy usage of your home.



Fix Up Your Furnace:



Having your furnace serviced can reduce heating costs by up to 5%.

Changing your furnace filters regularly increases air flow throughout your house.

To be safe, make sure carbon monoxide detectors have fresh batteries.

Professional Services:

Many cities have companies that you can hire to winterize your house. Before you hire them, check for online reviews and consult websites like the Better Business Bureau, Thumbtack, Angie's List and Home Advisor
