## A Brief Introduction to Prairie Village and Your Homes Association

Originally platted in 1941, J.C. Nichols began the development of what we now know as the City of Prairie Village. Beginning with the homes located between 67th and 69th Street and Mission Road and Del Mar, Nichols developed the community into what was deemed in 1949 by the National Association of Home Builders as the "best planned community in America." The design of pedestrian scaled residential blocks anchored by shared community shopping centers was revolutionary for its time and is often the envy of modern development.

J.C. Nichols then created Homes Associations, including the Prairie Village Homes Association of which you are a member. There are thirty-nine Homes Associations in the City of Prairie Village today. These Associations were created to "protect, preserve, and improve neighborhood property values by keeping homes attractive and desirable." \*

Sixty-nine years later, Prairie Village is a thriving city with many proud residents and scores of families seeking to relocate here. As times have changed, so have the expectations around single family residences and the amenities they offer. This includes items ranging from dwelling size (square feet), number of car garages, and building materials, all the way to innovative ways to improve energy efficiency through the use of higher performing insulations, new windows, and more efficient mechanical systems.

Many of you have begun to reshape the community on your own and your reinvestment in your home and community is valued. To act as a resource to help guide this redevelopment, the PVHA would like to investigate a partnership with the City of Prairie Village to create an Overlay District to help inform critical matters related to the built environment of Prairie Village. Many of Prairie Village's fundamental design qualities were set forth by J.C. Nichols within the restrictions of each Homes Association to be enforced. Unfortunately some of those restrictions have been found to be unenforceable and out of alignment with the City's current codes. (Some of the criteria often covered by overlay districts includes, but not limited to: building height, width, setbacks, exterior materials, and out buildings.)

Interest is building among the various Homes Associations of Prairie Village, with many voicing support of this effort. This initiative will seek public input and develop an understanding of what you value most and begin to establish enforceable expectations for these specified community qualities shared by the City and the Association alike. In order to move forward and learn more about the possibilities, the PVHA would like to gauge your interest in a dialogue with the City to help guide our future.
