Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Prairie Village Homes Association was held on March 4, 2009 in the Council Chambers of the Prairie Village Municipal Building. President **Ian Bartalos** presided. Ian reported that the Board's two main accomplishments for the year were to complete the task of updating our Bylaws and to respond more quickly to our members via email. Our guest speaker, Assistant City Administrator **Dennis Enslinger**, presented information on two programs that provide financial assistance to homeowners planning a home maintenance or improvement project. They are the Exterior Grant Program and the First Suburbs Loan Program. Dennis also previewed the anticipated changes to the way our trash is collected. Treasurer **Ron Nelson** presented an oral financial report. Printed copies were also made available. Ian reported that our city has asked the PVHA to contribute \$36,000 toward the repair of the fountain located on the island at 69 St, Oxford and El Monte. The new Board will take up this question at the next Board Meeting. The tribute to **Dick Haun** was postponed as Dick was not present to receive his award. Four members were elected to fill the open seats on our Board of Directors. **Britt Bieri**, **Joel Hanish** and **Jori Nelson** were elected to full three year terms. **Andrea Ernst** was elected to fill the remaining year of the seat vacated by **Bill Chinnery**. Member **Honey Barnekoff** asked if the updated Bylaws would be posted on line. Member **Jenny Haake** inquired as to the status of the creation of a Historic District and/or Overlay District. **Ann Doyle** announced that Friends of Village Fest is seeking monetary donations. Ian thanked the members for attending and the meeting adjourned.

Thank You for Your Service

We would like to thank our two outgoing Directors for their years of service to our association. **Sharon Chinnery** chose not to seek reelection after completing two full terms. Five of those years she served as our Secretary. Effective at the adjournment of our final regular Board Meeting of the year, **Bill Chinnery** chose to resign his seat with one year remaining on his second term. Sharon and Bill leave with our best wishes and thanks for their years of service to our association.

Exterior Grant Program

The Exterior Grant Program provides financial assistance to homeowners maintaining or improving the exterior of their homes. This program is in its second year. The grant would equal 20% of the total cost of the project. The grant may not exceed \$2500. The minimum cost of the project must total \$5000 and applies to exterior projects only. In our association, only homes west of or fronting Roe and south of or fronting 71 St are eligible to apply. An application and more information are available at City Hall.

First Suburbs Loan Program

The First Suburbs Loan Program offers home equity loans at reduced rates through Community Federal Bank. Owners of homes built between 1920 and 1950 with a current value not to exceed \$250,000 are eligible to apply. All homes within our association boundraies that meet the before mentioned criteria are eligible. An application and more information are available at City Hall. This program may be combined with the Exterior Grant Program.

Trash Collection

Our trash collection is contracted through our city and paid for though our city taxes. Our current contract with Deffenbaugh will expire at the end of this year. For the past several years, there has been a cap in place over what we pay Deffenbaugh for trash collection. We should expect to pay an additional 4% to 6% beginning in 2010. Our city is currently negotiating with multiple trash collection companies to find the best fit for our needs. We should expect changes in how our trash is collected no matter which company our city chooses.

Changes to regular trash collection may include a limit on the number of bags collected each week or the use of roller carts. Roller carts come in 32 and 64 gallon sizes. They would be provided by the trash collection company. Trash in the roller carts would not need to be bagged. We would use one cart for regular trash and one for recycling. Roller carts are currently used in neighboring cities. The challenge for homeowners would be storing the roller carts, which are larger than traditional trash cans, when they are not at the curb.

Yard waste will, most likely, no longer be accepted in plastic bags. Unlimited yard waste in sturdy paper bags or bundled with twine would remain acceptable.

With our current landfills reaching capacity, we can look for a renewed push to recycle more. To encourage recycling, #1 through #7 plastics are now and will continue to be accepted. For the safety of the sanitation workers, glass is not and will not be accepted at the curb. We can expect a northeast community recycling center that will accept glass to open up soon. There is also the possibility of earning "thank you" points based on the amount that we recycle by weight.

Lastly, the day of the week that our trash is picked up may change. Trash problems should be reported to City Hall. We can expect to receive more information on trash collection as details are worked out.

Working Together to Recycle

As you may be aware, the northeast community recycling center off of Metcalf has closed. Currently, the nearest recycling center that will accept glass is located on Hardy St just south of 119 St. Hardy St is located half way between Metcalf and Antioch. This location may not be convenient for everyone and makes recycling glass a challenge. A PVHA member has shared with us how they have met this challenge and suggest that more people try their simple plan. They accept glass from neighbors and drop it off along with their own. They suggest that we just talk with our neighbors. There is a good chance that someone on your block works or regularly shops in south Johnson County and would be happy to help out their community in this way.

Help Wanted

Island Volunteers We still have some islands that need adoption. We need people that are interested in beautifying our traffic islands by planting and maintaining the existing flower beds. Our city mows and otherwise maintains the grass areas on the islands. They will also trim the shrubbery if you choose not to. Most islands have urns or statuary that you may work your design around. You will be reimbursed for the plants you choose to use. You may volunteer as an individual, as a family or with a neighbor. Perhaps you know of a youth group that is looking for a service project. All volunteers are welcome.

We are fortunate to live in a relatively crime free community. Our Prairie Village Crime Prevention Officer, **Daniel Robles** recently reminded us of some simple things we can do to keep things that way. At home the three most effective safety tools are lights, locks and dogs. Exterior lighting is not just for beauty. It reduces dark spots where criminals might hide. It also illuminates our house numbers should emergency services need to find us fast. Secure locks on your doors and windows are effective. We should use them during the day as well as at night. This includes the doors that lead from our garages into our homes. Dogs, even small ones, will alert us when strangers approach our homes. They provide a security alarm that works 24/7 even when the power goes out. Additionally, we should landscape with safety in mind. Trimming foundation shrubs up from the ground will expose the feet of someone trying to hide. Planting roses or other thorny plants under windows makes that a more difficult point of entry. Criminals want easy access without attention. Lights, locks and barking dogs will provide them with the exact opposite. You may get more information regarding crime prevention from the Prairie Village Police Department. By being proactive, we can discourage crime and continue to enjoy the relative safety that our community is known for.
