The details are as follows:

Date: Saturday, September 8th
Time: 8:00 am to 12:00 noon*
Location: Hale Cook School, 7302 Pennsylvania
Traffic: Enter on Pennsylvania (North or South) and exit on Jefferson
Required: Proof of residence is required. This event is only for those living in KC, MO
Suggested Donation: One can of food or one dollar to donate to Harvesters

* NOTE 1: Maximum allowed limit of 200 cars bringing hazardous waste is usually reached by 11:00 am, so, plan to come early.

* NOTE 2: Cars with only leaves, brush, tires and non-hazardous recycling will be accepted until the 12:00 noon deadline.

Consult the following for what can and cannot be brought to the event. Materials will be accepted from residences only. Business waste is not accepted. If you can't buy an item at a store, it's probably not residential waste. Twenty gallon and 55 gallon drums are considered business waste and will not be accepted. No material in containers larger than 5 gallon buckets can be brought to this event.
