## President's Message

The WHHA Board of Directors has been considering several new ideas for our association, such as:

Fourth of July Parade

The front page of this newsletter should give you all the information you need about our First Annual Fourth of July Parade. We encourage everyone to come with your decorated bikes, etc. Please bring your children and/or grandchildren for some old-fashioned fun!

Lights for Triangle Park

After lengthy discussion, your Board voted to apply for a Public Improvements Advisory Committee (PIAC) grant to install some 8 to 10 decorative lights in Triangle Park, along its perimeter and next to its playground. These would be similar to lights in other parks, such as Brookside Park (a.k.a. "Suicide Hill") or Loose Park. Such lights would enhance both the safety and beauty of the park. They would have neither the strength nor the glare of city lights and hence should not bother anyone who lives nearby.



Our homes association would not have to contribute any funds toward this project. This is good because PIAC grants are designed for expensive projects. The estimated cost of this one would be around \$60,000.

Hearings on current PIAC proposals for our District (4) will be held on Tuesday, June 19, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Westport Roanoke Community Center, 3601 Roanoke Rd., and on Thursday, June 28, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., at the Discovery Center at 4750 Troost. A healthy attendance from the neighborhood helps greatly in winning grant approval.

#### **Banners**

The Board also is considering purchasing banners for our association, similar to ones displayed for the Brookside Art Fair, or in the Morningside neighborhood. They could be displayed on city light poles at the four corners of our area. At an approximate cost of \$500 we could pay for the banners, which last for 5 to 7 years, out of our general funds. No action was taken on this proposal. The Board considered having a contest for selecting the design for our banner.

**Snow Plowing** 

We have received several complaints about the sorry state of snow plowing by the City in our neighborhood. Therefore we discussed hiring a private contractor, as some other associations do, to plow our neglected streets, at a cost of \$25 per snowfall for each street plowed. WE NEED YOUR INPUT ON THIS MATTER. Please email or call any Board member with your suggestions or questions.

Please note that if we were to decide to contract for this service, we would have to have a special assessment on the dues in order to fund it. This assessment would require a vote of the members attending our Annual Business Meeting in November.


