Annual Meeting

January 17, 2024 at Indian Hills Country Club

- The meeting was called to order by Cory Merriman.
- A welcome was given to any new residents, to members serving on city committees. TRHA is the largest HA in Mission Hills with 551 members. Introductions were made of current board members (see above). There was a motion to approve the minutes from the 2023 annual meeting. The motion passed.
- The park board report was then presented by Louis Allen. She presented a brief background of their work regarding the parkettes and Eisenhower Pond. Eisenhower Pond is in need of irrigation and beautification. The city will take care of the maintenance, but TRHA needs to cover the cost of the system and beautification. The beautification needed is for the 1 foot shoreline to “clean it up”. Why not irrigate from the pond itself? The irrigation mechanics do not allow for it. There will be some road closures and disruption with the maintenance of the pond, but it’s an important feature that needs attention. Tomahawk gets 3100 cars daily, and it’s a part of the city that is seen by many. The city has taken care of the geese situation, and helped them find new homes. The Northwest part will not have irrigation because it is not our jurisdiction. There was then a motion to approve. “The TRHA board has the authority to vote to allocate funds for the Eisenhower Pond projects”. The motion passed.
- A City Council report was then presented by Andy Weed. He highlighted that three sidewalks have been built along State Line Road, funded with excess funds. The city is looking for other properties to add sidewalks to, and it was suggested that 63rd and 67th be considered because they are highly trafficked. It was then announced that 65th and 67th power lines will be moved underground, as well as new “Cobra” street lights added. The project should begin Spring of 2024. Some curb repair through the city is in the works, and it was asked of residents to report any street damage seen to City Hall.
- The President, Cory Merriman, thanked everyone for participating and adjourned the meeting.
