

upkeep goes a long way in preserving the beauty and value of our community!

Home maintenance tips to consider

Roof and gutters: Check for missing or damaged shingles. Gutter clean-outs prevent drainage issues.



Landscaping: Trim overgrown trees and shrubs. Replace any dead plants. Add fresh mulch to beds.

Driveways and walkways: Enhance curb appeal and prevent trip hazards by repairing concrete or pavers.

Your neighborhood pond shifted into serene mode during two recent deep freeze periods (with a brief



respite in between seen in the slushy photo at right). Temperatures climbed sharply again Feb. 24. Will this winter see any more snow days with temps low enough to freeze the pond? Mixed projections find the Almanac a 'no' but the Groundhog a solid 'yes.'

Pond Committee is planning for the 2025 pond season and intends to coax the aerator fountains out of winter dormancy in mid-April just before Easter on April 20.

To ward off filamentous algae and pondweeds, Pond Committee has engaged Paola-based Aquatic Ecosystem Consultants for 14 pond treatments April to October aboard their own watercraft. The committee itself has performed these tasks for many years. But in light of a shift in membership and loss of our pondadjacent chemical storage depot, we explored bids for treatment and found one reasonable and within our existing budget. Thanks to Keith Read and Max Mueller for managing both the bid process and the transition.



As I write this, we have ice and snow all over the place! But with warm weather soon to come, more neighbors will be traversing our trails. Be sure to check, frequently, that the trail running along your property is clear of leaves, sticks and weeds.

Do you have a couple extra hours per month to help with planning and/or caring for the common

areas in Northwood Trails? We can use your help. Our Grounds Committee meets monthly on the third Monday evening to address necessary maintenance of all 16 areas.

Spring is approaching, and that means we are gearing up for trail maintenance and repairs. This year our trail budget was increased slightly to \$75,000; last



year's trail budget was \$70,000. Maintenance last year included more seal coating than we have typically done in the past. Our hope in seal coating is that we will get a longer trail life for fewer dollars.

Our neighborhood has approximately

4.5 miles of walking trails. Last year, we seal coated 2,035 linear feet (about 0.39 mi) of trails, and installed asphalt on a separate 1,260 linear feet (0.24 miles). As all of you walkers know, we seem to be losing ground on trail maintenance. This year will require more involved (and expensive) repairs to areas that have been damaged by ground water and poor drainage.

We can all help to make our trails last longer, which helps control our annual dues and maintains our property values. Please check any trails adjacent to your home and clean up any clumps of leaves or mud; moisture is an enemy of asphalt paving. Also, pay attention to shrubbery overgrowth or overhanging limbs. It is the responsibility of all homeowners to keep the trails accessible and safe; if you don't trim your limbs, someone else may, and you might not be happy with the results!

Please do not throw clippings or cuttings in an area adjacent to the trails, even if the other side of the trail is a "natural" area. Besides being an eyesore, these discards take a long time to decompose and provide a haven to critters and weeds that we would rather not have so close to homes. Also, it never hurts to pick up a little litter if you see it around the neighborhood.
