Tulips are in full bloom and spring has sprung here in Northwood Trails! Summer annuals will be planted after the tulips are finished showing off.



Pool Tower porch. Bob Gamache removed naughty words from a porch tabletop. Regina and Tony Wittman cleaned out a squirrel's nest.



The Northwood Trails Pond is ready for spring and summer enjoyment with your family and guests.

Early morning exercisers will find a serene pondscape as the sun comes up and have a good chance of seeing a heron. At mid-morning, the twin aerator fountains burst to life for visual appeal that helps oxygenate the pond in concert with our three bubblers.

By mid-day, if the weather is warm, fish will gather near the dock at any sign of a potential feeding. Your kids or grandkids will have a blast with 25¢ per generous handful of feed from our feeder on the dock. In the late afternoon, you're likely to spot a turtle or two sunning on rocks by the shore. Each night around 10 p.m., the aerators clock out and stillness returns in an instant. It

won't be long before the frogs' ribbits will become common.

The aerators are tuned up and running well thanks to Keith Read. His annual preventative maintenance extends their

life and cuts down on repair trips on the boat. Keith and Max Mueller have been out taking care of various tasks, including diagnosis and repair of the cable powering the dock lights after finding a critter had gnawed on it.

Aquatic Ecosystem Consultants have been out a few times to treat the pond with inputs to control algae and clarify the water in the pond.

#### This month's Deed Refresher: No. 6, fences:

No fence shall be erected without prior written consent. The maximum height of any fence shall be six feet, and the material shall be limited to wood, wrought iron or masonry. No other metal, chain link or other similar fences shall be permitted. No dog or animal pens or runs of any kind shall be permitted. Fences shall not be erected in the front or side yards of the dwellings and shall not be placed farther toward the front of the dwelling than a straight line extended from the rear building line of said dwelling. Any decorative or privacy fence for a side entrance or patio which extends forward of the rear building line shall not be constructed without prior written approval.
