There's Still Time to Register for Google Fiber

As you've probably heard by now, Kansas City has been chosen as the first in the United States for the installation of Google Fiber, a brand-new type of service that offers internet connection speeds more than 100 times faster than the average broadband, as well as high-def TV packages. It's not only a great service, some experts believe that having a Google Fiber connection could add thousands of dollars to the value of a home.

In order to have the fiber network installed, neighborhood (or "Fiberhood") residents have to band together to pre-register their interest by Sept. 9—and the neighborhoods with the highest percentages of pre-registrations will be hooked up first.
