All residents received a postcard and email with an invitation to attend, and a good crowd showed up to enjoy appetizers and hear from our guest speakers. This year, we were joined by a city council member, city official, and a representative from the KCPD to discuss community issues!

REAL ESTATE RECAP:

For 2025 as of 3/22/25, Verona Hills had 0 active homes listed, 4 coming soon, 4 homes under contract, and 6 homes sold.

The minimum sold price was \$400,000, and the maximum sold price was \$535,000.

The average sale price was \$456,825. The average number of days on the market was 18.

Our neighborhood continues to be strong - a win/win for all of us!

COMPLIANCE CORNER: Who's Ready to Get Involved?

I have stayed on as the Director of Compliance for a couple of years past my initial term. Now it's time for me to step down to attend to some of the other boards for which I volunteer. As a result, we're looking for a new Director of Compliance to take my place. This position has often been filled by a lawyer in the neighborhood, but that's not actually required at all. Instead, the Director of Compliance is primarily responsible for answering basic questions from homeowners who are looking to erect a fence, add a pool, add on to their home, build a deck, and the like. It's a pretty easy gig, as the answers are always the same, and I'll be available to assist whoever takes on this role until they are comfortable. Plus, it's a great way to meet your neighbors! TREASURER'S REPORT: Annual Dues and Liens Collected



Our fiscal year runs from June 1 through May 31, with annual assessment of \$150 due by June 30 each year. Our assessments have not been raised for many years, and they are meant to be affordable for all our residents. Please make sure to pay your assessments on time. They allow us to enjoy many of the core services you have come to expect and are highlighted in this newsletter, as well as continue to evaluate other services and events for the benefit of our neighborhood.

Did you know you can pay your dues online? Go to our website, www.veronahills.org, and our online payment portal is front and center! You will be able to make a one-time payment or set it up on auto debit going forward. You will only need your account number which can be found on your dues statement, or by calling our management company Homes Associations of Kansas City at 913-385-2440.

We have a collection policy in place that includes filing liens on properties once they become due for a third year on their assessments. Once a lien is filed, not only are individuals being invoiced for past due assessments, but also interest is added at 8% on the balance, and legal expenses incurred by the Association are included. Once an assessment is over four years past due, we are obligated by our Homes Association Declaration to file suit to collect the delinquent assessments. This action increases expenses, including legal, filing fees and court costs, which are added to the delinquent assessment amount. The cost to file a lien is approximately \$100, and the average expense if an account goes to trial is over \$1,000.

In addition, a filed lien or judgment may have negative consequences on your credit rating. Overall, your Board of Directors would rather spend our volunteer time (and your hard-earned money!) providing services and improving the neighborhood, rather than exhaust the time and money collecting delinquent accounts. Further, it is not fair to the homeowners who pay when the assessments are due.

Our cash flow statement for the previous fiscal year is on our website. As a board we can confidently say our neighborhood remains in strong financial standing, with ample reserves to position us to address any unforeseen problems, continue to keep our streets safe from inclement weather, and further invest in our neighborhood. SECURITY UPDATE: Keeping Our Neighborhood Safe



Since our summer 2024 newsletter, REPORTED crimes are slightly up but overall relatively static. While we've had several personal calls and concerns about suspicious folks in the area, we please ask that if you feel in danger, call 911 immediately. If you just want to report a nuisance individual and don't need immediate attention, it's best to call the South Patrol non-emergency number at 816-234-5550, option 4.

As you all know, it is the goal of the Board to prevent criminal activity in our neighborhood. The best way to prevent criminal activity is to reduce opportunities by keeping garage doors closed, doggie doors protected, your home well-lit, and your vehicles and home securely locked. If you need to request additional patrols in a specific area, you can request that online a www.kcpd.org.

I've pulled together crime stats that have been reported since last summer. Since the 1st of the year, crime has been slow, but there seems to have been an uptick last fall. Reported crimes from 7/1/24 to 3/25/25 are as follows: 1 identity theft, 1 enticement, 1 residential burglary, 2 fraud, 5 thefts from auto, 4 stolen autos, 1 armed robbery, 1 property damage, 1 stealing (other), and 1 quality of life. These statistics were pulled from www.cityprotect.com. I highly recommend you visit this site, where you can gather more intel on specific crimes. For example, the only armed robbery we had in the last 9 months was at 2 a.m. just off Wornall.

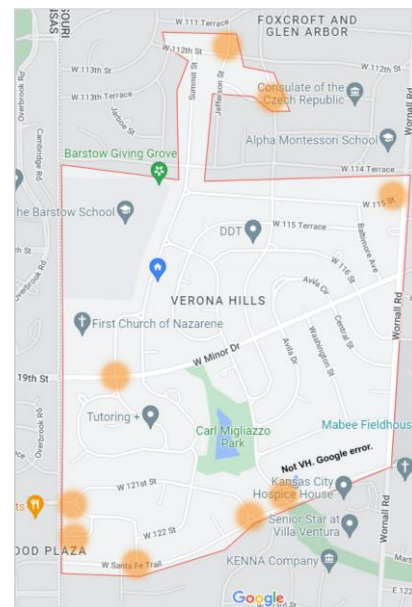
We did have our South Patrol liaison officer at our Annual Meeting in January. If you missed her speech, review of crime stats, and overall Q&A, her feedback was quite similar to what we always suggest here. Aim to prevent easy crime and make sure you report anything you witness.

Since our last newsletter, we have added an additional 2 cameras in the neighborhood. If you already have surveillance cameras on your home, please register with WatchKC so you can be a part of the solution to crime in our city. If you should experience any type of crime, please feel free to reach out and we will look through the footage and pass it along to South Patrol for their review. We have also increased security around Migliazzo Park. Titan has been effective at making emergency calls on site when bad behavior has been taking place. Also, we have an LPR (License Plate Reading) camera in that area now, so we can more effectively track vehicles around the park that may be causing issues.

We are still looking for more volunteers for camera installation on their home! This is a ZERO cost opportunity. If you have a home in any of the highlighted areas highlighted on this map near entrances to our neighborhood, please reach out! You can email me at dave.bman@icloud.com if you're interested.

Overall, we believe with the help of our alert and caring neighbors, along with the KCPD and Titan, Verona Hills is a very safe place to live. Verona Hills Home Featured on the TV Show Bargain Mansions



Charles and Juanita Moran were residents of Verona Hills since they had a Koehler home custom-built on the corner of Summit Street and Madison Avenue in 1990. They raised their four children - Karen, Mark, Alex, and Susie - in that home. Charles taught Political Science for 50 years at Rockhurst College/University. At the age of 83, he retired in 2020 as Professor Emeritus for his distinguished service to the Rockhurst Community. He retired from the U.S. Army Reserve in 1996 at the mandatory retirement age of 60, having achieved the rank of Sergeant Major. Juanita was a homemaker and took pride in her family and her beautiful home. Their greatest source of pride was always their family. Charles met the love of his life, Juanita, when he was leading a student trip to Mexico in 1975. They were married on New Year's Day 1977 in Jaunita's hometown of Torreon, Coahuila. In addition to four kids, they had seven grandchildren that were their pride and joy.

Charles had a heart attack on Super Bowl Sunday 2023. After that, he had a hard time with the stairs at their home. They had no bedrooms on the first floor, and it became difficult for him to go up a flight of stairs. He was 86 years old at the time of his heart attack. He didn't want to move unless the home stayed in the family, something he was adamant about. Charles and Juanita put an offer on a new house in Leawood the evening it went on the market, and Karen and her husband, David Redlich, agreed to purchase their home. The home at 11712 Madison Avenue was built in 1990 and Charles and Juanita Moran lived there for 33 years. The home had been meticulously maintained, but it had not had many cosmetic updates.

Bargain Mansions was looking for homes to renovate for Season 6 of their show. They were looking for something in South Kansas City and they reached out to Karen and David in the fall of 2023. The Redlichs liked the idea that the renovations would be done quickly (a 13-week film schedule), and they provided a designer with a vision that would go beyond any simple renovations they would have made on their own.

The initial filming (the before) was done on November 1, 2023. Karen, David, and their three school-aged children moved out the following week and the crew filmed regularly until mid-February. The reveal was on February 14, 2024, during the Chiefs parade. The renovations focused on the first floor.

The kitchen was completely gutted, the back door was moved to the hearth room, and new French doors were added to replace the sliding back door. The carpet was removed from the family room, living room and dining room. Bargain Mansions laced in the same wood flooring to match the entryway and kitchen with a lighter stain. A doorway that went from the family room to the living room was closed off and the front room was changed from a formal living room into an office with French doors on the side facing the entryway. The dining room was painted and had wainscoting put up. The fireplaces in the family room and the hearth room were updated. The wet bar in the family room was updated with new tile and the sink was removed. They added an office nook under the stairs to make better use of empty space. The entire first floor was painted (or wallpaper in some areas) and new light fixtures installed. New carpet was installed on the front and back staircases. The half bathroom and laundry room were also updated but did not make it into the TV show. The biggest wow factor is the kitchen. It now has a huge island that seats 8 people and a beautiful large picture window that faces the backyard. A wall was constructed where the kitchen previously ended and now has a scullery, which has a second sink, dishwasher, refrigerator and

huge pantry with a new doorway coming in from the garage. The size of the outdoor living space was doubled with a covered cedar pergola and a custom-made fire pit forged by the show's star, Tamara Day.

Charles passed away at the age of 87, surrounded by family, two weeks before the reveal was filmed. The Redlichs, as well as two of Karen's brothers and two family friends, were filmed for the official reveal. Juanita had an opportunity to meet with Tamara Day on the day of the filming, and enjoyed Tamara showing her the updates on the home in which she raised her family. Tamara showed Juanita how she updated her dining room set, which is still in the same spot it has been since Charles and Juanita moved into their home. Charles and Juanita loved their Verona Hills home and their neighbors and were thrilled the home would be staying in the family. — Joe Lewellen
