The April financials have been reviewed and found to be in order.

This month we have five delinquencies. Two homeowners are one month in arrears, and I expect these to be corrected without any additional action. One homeowner is two months in arrears, and includes late fees and penalties. I have prepared and sent a letter reminding the homeowner to bring their account to currency, including their late fees and interest. And unfortunately, two homeowners are three or more months in arrears and were referred to the HA-KC for communication and processing.

I want to continue to remind all residents to take advantage of the HA-KC's automated check handling service and simplify the monthly dues process. Through this free program, your monthly payments are automatically deducted from your bank account, and eliminates the worry of your monthly dues reaching the HA-KC on time. LAWN AND GROUNDS REPORT – John Rudzinski

Precision Lawn Activities for June – Precision Lawn will continue mowings on Thursdays, weather permitting. The week of June 17th, Precision Lawn will trim shrubs and apply insecticide in the common areas and the front yards of the homeowner's property. If you **do not** want your shrubs trimmed or sprayed, please put up a sign in your front yard. The week of June 24th, Precision Lawn will apply the third round of fertilizer with grub control. A Directory Spot email notification will be sent out a few days prior to the activity taking place as a reminder.

Other Lawn Reminders – 1) Check your flower beds and make sure they are weeded regularly; 2) Check the trees in your yard to ensure there is an 8-foot canopy as the mowers need to drive under the trees to mow. Also, make sure your trees are clear of your neighbor's fence and the perimeter fence; 3) If you would like your back yard mowed and you have a fence, be sure to unlock the gate and pick up after your dog prior to Thursday' mowing; 4) Check the stone boarders around your trees and flowers beds to ensure nothing has fallen into the mowers path and pick up any branches and twigs from your lawn; 5) Chipmunks love to burrow, so be sure to check for soil erosion around driveways and sidewalks.
