Tree Inspection and Treatment – The Board has arranged for a discounted opportunity to have your trees inspected and treated, should that be necessary. Ryan Lawn & Tree will treat your trees for a cost of \$150 per tree which is a discount of \$25. Call them at 913-381-1505 and mention you are from Westmont and interested in tree inspection and the discounted rate for treatment, if needed. Note: As a homeowner, it's your decision on the vendor and your responsibility to take care of your trees, not the HOA. It's important to care for your trees as they are a great asset to your property value and the community. The cost to have a tree removed due to disease will be far greater that the cost to treat a tree. A flyer with additional details will be distributed via Directory Spot.

LAWN AND GROUNDS REPORT – John Rudzinski

Precision Lawn Activities for June/July – Lawn mowing will continue weekly on Thursdays, weather permitting. Week of June 22 – Precision Lawn will apply the third round of fertilizer with grub control after the weekly mowing, either Thursday or Friday. Week of June 30 – Precision Lawn will trim shrubs and apply insecticide in the common areas and front yards of homeowner's property. If you do not want these services, please put up a sign in your front yard. A Directory Spot email notification will be sent out a few days prior to the activity taking place.

Tree Trimming Near Power Lines – Approximately 15-16 homes in Westmont have tree branches growing into the power lines along Antioch and 119th Street. To prevent potential power outages, we are proactively working with Evergy to schedule tree trimming. There are a few important steps in this process:

- Evergy will coordinate a scheduled time for the work.
- Each affected homeowner will need to sign a permission form to allow Evergy access to their backyard.
- Evergy will handle the trimming, but homeowners will be responsible for promptly cleaning up any branches or debris left behind.

We will share more as we finalize the details and schedule with Evergy. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our neighborhood safe and powered.

Tree Maintenance Reminder – As a homeowner, it's your responsibility to keep your trees properly maintained—including those in the boulevard area in front of your home. This means trimming dead limbs, maintaining a safe and healthy canopy height, and ensuring that branches do not overhang or damage your neighbor's property or the perimeter fence. If you've had a tree removed, the stump should be ground down to ground level and the area either replanted with a new tree or grassed over to maintain a clean and consistent appearance. Regular tree care not only keeps our neighborhood looking well-kept, but also helps prevent safety hazards and property damage. Thank you for doing your part to keep Westmont beautiful and safe!
