

Speed bumps: A calming possibility

Tired of lead-footed drivers speeding down your quiet, leafy streets?

At any given time, especially during rush hours, 50th Street and Westwood Road can do cheap imitations of the Kansas Speedway. Drivers frequently exceed the 25 mph limit. And much appears to be "cut-through" traffic between Ward Parkway and State Line Road. Some residents think the recent criminal activity in the neighborhood and the eventual completion of the nearby West Edge office/hotel project give a sense of urgency to the issue of traffic control.

One solution could be the installation of speed bumps on one or more of our busiest streets. Speed bumps are low-rise, paved berms that span a street, curb to curb, requiring motorists to slow down in order to cross them. Examples can be seen in Westwood Hills, Kansas, just across State Line from our Westwood Park neighborhood.

Speed bumps, or "traffic-calming devices," are one of the "most successful and commonly used techniques for reducing speeds," according to the Street and Traffic Division of the KCMO Public Works Department. But such devices are not installed indiscriminately. Public Works follows a set of published criteria for determining whether speed bumps are warranted, considering a street's location and its posted speed limit, among other things.

Security issues front and center at HA meeting

In the wake of recent crimes, security was the main topic of discussion at the April 4 annual meeting of the Westwood Park Homes Association.

Since winter, several burglaries and even a few armed robberies have been reported in the area. At April's meeting two residents related details of being robbed at gunpoint on separate evenings in front of their homes on Westwood Road and on Mercier.

In response to the criminal activity the WPHA board has been researching the possibility of hiring private security to patrol the neighborhood. At the meeting Board President Kirby Upjohn reported that it might be possible to join with three other Country Club District neighborhood associations — Stratford Park, Greenway Fields and Romanelli West — to share costs of hiring off-duty KCMO police officers to patrol each evening. Possible drawbacks are that only one officer patrols all four neighborhoods and for only four hours each evening.

Cost is another factor. Kirby estimated that half of Westwood Park households would voluntarily pay a share of the cost. That would mean about \$90 per year for those who pay.

Although strong support was shown at the meeting for the possibility of

hiring private security, other approaches were discussed. Among them were urging the KCMO Police Department to improve on-duty service and urging residents to take greater responsibility for looking out for each other and improving neighborhood communication.

Since April, WPHA board members have met with city officials about hiring private security. At press time no decision had been reached.

Other highlights of the April meeting:

- Kirk Gastinger explained a petition effort for the city to begin a study of the neighborhood's busiest streets for the possibility of installing speed bumps (see story on page 1).
- Kirby Upjohn announced that the KCMO Public Investment Advisory Committee has approved two grants for the revitalization of the Westwood Park. One, for \$200,000, will pay for two new park shelters, to be completed this year, and removal of the old shelter. The other, for \$250,000, will go toward construction of new park trails and other land improvements sometime in 2008.
- Ann Nixon announced that another stone neighborhood marker will be built this year at 49th and Mercier streets. Three smaller signs are planned for 48th Street.
- Joan Gastinger reported that there are now 18 representatives in the Block Captain program. Some blocks are still unrepresented. Volunteers can call Joan at 931-8819.
- A directory of residents' names and contact information is being produced.

The process begins when a neighborhood association asks the Street and Traffic Division to begin a study. A substantial percentage of residents in proximity to streets in question must support the proposed study by signing a petition. If the study finds a need, city staff and neighborhood association work together to determine a suitable plan. All this, of course, takes time.

Watch for Westwood Park block captains, who will be petitioning residents on the issue of speed bumps. For more information call Susan Hard, 531-1950.




